


























Early University Offers for Byron Bay High School Students








Exciting News from the CAPAL Department

On Tuesday 14 November, our School Vice Captains, Ethan and Georgia, and Captains, Xander and I, travelled to Brisbane with Mr Minton to attend National Young Leaders Day. The day is intended to inspire future leaders of our generation, with talks made by leaders within our community. We began by hearing from John Coutis, who shared an amazing story about how he has overcome extreme adversity within his life. John was born with a severe disability which rendered his legs useless and faced relentless bullying throughout his childhood. Despite this he overcame all obstacles to become an international speaker and inspiring advocate for achieving success, whatever kind of success that may be. John left us with the important message to write down your goals. John said this was the key in his ability to overcome whatever challenges he faced in life. He said to have goals that focused on determination, strength and purpose. We all agreed that John was a truly inspiring speaker and felt very moved by his story.

The second speaker was an amazing young leader named Prudence Melom. Prudence began by telling us her story. She was born in a small African village in Chad and grew up with her siblings, mother and father. When she was four Prudence's father was taken away from their family. Prudence, her mother and her siblings had to flee, but without vehicle transportation they had no choice but to walk. Finally they were accepted as refugees and then lived in a refugee camp for seven years. During this time they were reunited with Prudence's father, a very happy moment for her. After seven years in a refugee camp Prudence and her family were relocated to Australia. Prudence's story was one of strength in a time of extreme hardship and she now uses her story to promote harmony and respect throughout Australia. Since then Prudence has founded the e-Raced project, a project that aims to eliminate racism in Australia, through the telling of refugee and immigrant stories. Prudence's drive and determination was very inspiring to all of us as leaders and Prudence leads by example for what an ideal leader can achieve.

The final speaker that we heard from was Rugby League legend, Gordon Tallis. As a person who has pushed himself to mental and physical limits he had many valuable lessons to share with us. He stressed the importance of loyalty and staying true to your own values. Gordon's perseverance and resilience was inspirational to all of us as young leaders.

All in all the day was a great success, we took away many valuable lessons that we shall carry through our leadership role at Byron Bay High and then into later life.
